*ELIGIBILITY

Any person of full age (18 years or over) shall be eligible to hold the office of Welfare Chairman provided that:

- They are ordinarily resident in this Island on the date of their nomination and have been ordinarily resident in this Island
 (i) for a period of two years immediately before that date, or (a)

 - for a period or periods of at least five years in the aggregate at any time before that date;
- (b) they shall be ordinarily resident in the Parish at the date of their nomination;
- they have not at any time during the five years immediately preceding the date of their election have been sentenced (c) for an offence by a court in the United Kingdom, any of the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, to imprisonment for a period of six months or more (whether suspended or not) without the option of a fine, unless that sentence was quashed or reduced to less than six months on appeal.
- (d) Are registered on the Guernsey electoral Role.
